# About the Foundation

## Mission

Our Family for Families First Foundation is committed to supporting military families in the pursuit of higher education and establishing a tradition of community service.



## History

Our Family for Families First Foundation is a private charitable foundation established in 2006 by John G. Picerne. Mr. Picerne is the president and CEO of Picerne Military Housing, one of the military's premier privatized housing providers serving Fort Meade, Md.; Fort Bragg, N.C.; Fort Polk, La.; Fort Rucker, Ala.; Fort Riley, Kan.; Fort Sill, Okla., and Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md. The Foundation operates due to the generous endowment established by John G. Picerne. The Foundation has an operating staff of three and a governing board to provide a broad view of the needs of the Army community we serve.



## Operating Principles

In 2001, Foundation founder, John Picerne, established the credo of service to military families that Picerne Military Housing operates under -- *Families First*<sup>®</sup>. The Foundation is a national resource for military families to identify educational opportunities and reach their goals and its staff is dedicated to supporting the children and spouses of active-duty Soldiers in the pursuit of secondary education. Focus areas include:

- Supporting children of service members by providing \$50,000 scholarships to four-year colleges and universities.
- Supporting spouses of service members by providing \$5,000 education grants for community colleges and universities.
- Supporting children and spouses with mentoring and internship programs to guide and encourage their long-term career and personal goals.



In addition to educational outreach, the Foundation works with each of the communities that Picerne Military Housing serves to identify local charities to be "adopted" by dedicated employees within the organization. The Foundation recruits Picerne Military Housing employee volunteers as well as their family and friends to perform community service at selected charities. In the past, employees have performed service projects at many charities including: the Hope House, Turning Point Shelter, Chrysalis Home for Girls, Sarah's House, Star Cross Rehabilitation Ranch, USO, Wounded Warriors Project, and the USO. The impact of this work in these communities has been tremendous.

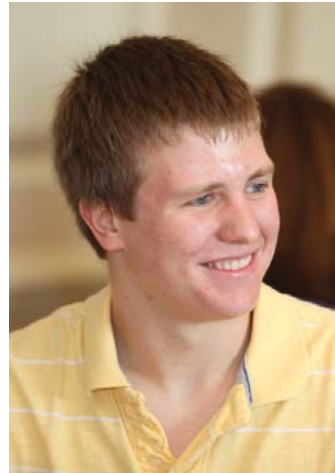
The military life involves sacrifice, hard work, and determination and my parents instilled a strong work ethic and will to succeed in me. These are the

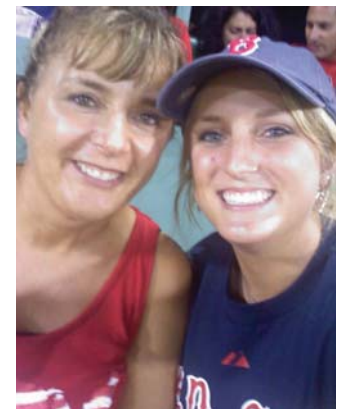

 Whitney is on the Dean's List with a 3.91 GPA at Baylor University. She is studying Biology and is an active member of the Baylor rowing team.



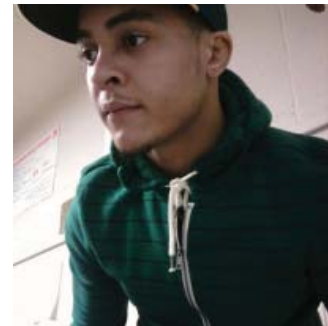
**Katie N., Cornell University**

Our Family for Families First Foundation and the Red Sox Foundation have entered into a partnership to serve wounded veterans returning from Afghanistan and Iraq.

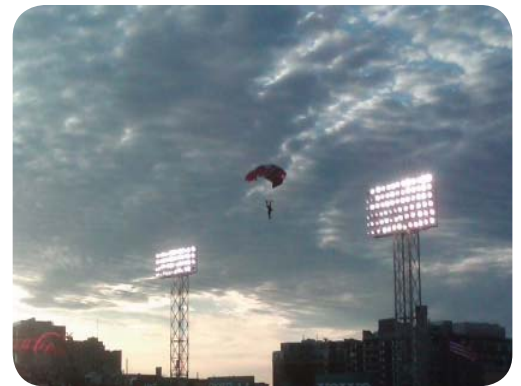

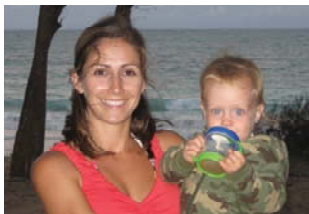


**M**elissa H., Fort Bragg 2007

# Giving Back

Volunteers Changing Their Local Communities



**Fort Bragg, North Carolina.** The Fort Bragg Adopt-A-Charity selected the Armed Services YMCA to adopt in 2010 and supported several events and projects:

- **Baby Bundles:** volunteers bagged baby bundles, and the packages were delivered to active duty spouses who recently delivered a baby at WOMACK Army Medical Center.
- **Tween Center Makeover:** volunteers "made over" the Tween Center, a space for kids between the ages of 8 and 15 to go after school. The AAC committee provided and assembled chairs, tables and entertainment centers, and hung artwork. Volunteers painted the center, installed blinds, cabinets and countertops.
- **Holiday Hearts Program:** volunteers unloaded gifts from the Armed Services YMCA warehouse and sorted toys and clothes for

the Holiday Hearts program. Volunteers also shopped for gifts for military families suffering extreme financial hardship.

**Fort Sill, Oklahoma.** Fort Sill took on a large first project at the J. Roy Dunning Children's Shelter to provide the bare necessities for children who have been taken out of the home for reasons ranging from abuse to emergencies. The children at J. Roy Dunning have little to no belongings, and the team provided the basics, as well as bright new comforters and pillows to go along with the freshly remodeled bedrooms and gathering areas.

**East Greenwich, Rhode Island.** The corporate team made much-needed improvements to the Lend-A-Hand Horse Farm, a therapeutic riding facility for children and adults.

**Fort Polk, Louisiana.** Fort Polk worked at a battered women's shelter, Turning Point. The team primed the old wall paper in the 150 foot hallway and painting it a brighter color in an effort to make the shelter feel more like home. Volunteers also painted the dining room located off of the hallway to provide a nice flow of color and sense warmth for residents. Priming and painting the trim of 36 doors proved to be a herculean task. In addition, we installed vinyl flooring over the 12 inch tiles that were worn with years of traffic in the common area.

Picerne Military Housing employees donated tens of thousands of dollars to charities important to them, and the Foundation matched those dollars 2-1. Donations were made to charities ranging from Haiti relief to local community colleges, hospitals, and arts centers as well as large charities such as Susan G Koman Race for the Cure.



## For Our Soldiers



Every year, the Foundation sends care packages to the deployed parents and spouses of our scholarship and grant recipients. Happily, 2010 presented the fewest deployed parents and husbands since the Foundation's beginning three years ago. We sent goodies to 10 Soldiers deployed in Afghanistan and Iraq.

The Soldier's families were asked to send us a list of "favorite things." Cookies and books topped most lists. We sent crossword puzzle books, historical fiction, Vanilla Wafers, insulated mugs, slippers, and much more.

We hope that our commitment to the Foundation mission and visibility of small gestures brings an added appreciation for the sacrifices our military men and women, and their families, make every day and the impact that a few people can make through community service.

**STAFF MEMBERS.** In addition to the Board of Directors, the Foundation is supported by full- and part-time staff and volunteers. Together, Melissa Ballou, Dawn Parker, and Dave Sweeney serve as the front-line for the organization, handling day-to-day operations.



## Application Process and Outreach

**ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS AND ORGANIZATIONS.** Our Family for Families First serves Army families and communities. Persons are eligible to apply for educational scholarships and grants if they are the children or spouses of active-duty Soldiers at Fort Meade, Md.; Fort Bragg, N.C.; Fort Polk, La.; Fort Rucker, Ala.; Fort Riley, Kan.; Fort Sill, Okla., and Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md. Eligible applicants for the Our Future Scholarship must be seniors graduating from high school.

The Foundation does not accept applications or funding requests directly from charities or non-profit organizations. "Adopted" charities at each of our locations are selected by Foundation staff and volunteers.

**HOW THE PROCESS WORKS.** The educational scholarship and grant application process is open from November of each year through February (for scholarships) and through May (for grants) of the following year. Applications can be found online at [www.ourfamilyfoundation.org](http://www.ourfamilyfoundation.org). Complete instructions for the application process and eligibility requirements are included with the application form. Applicants must be family members of active-duty Soldiers assigned to Fort Meade, Md.; Fort Bragg, N.C.; Fort Polk, La.; Fort Rucker, Ala.; Fort Riley, Kan.; Fort Sill, Okla., and Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md. on the due date of the application.

All applicants are notified in writing by the Foundation. If selected, scholarship and grant recipients are required to meet certain academic standards.



# Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Our Family for Families First Foundation has been helping military families reach their educational goals through scholarship and grant programs since 2006. The Foundation's mission of supporting military families through the pursuit of higher education, a tradition of community service and professional development is the driving force behind all of the Foundation programs. Following the lead of founder, John G. Picerne, we are passionate about supporting the educational goals of military families who selflessly give of themselves in defense of our nation.

2010 was a special year for the Foundation, as our first class of scholarship recipients began their senior year of college and prepared to graduate. We are so proud of the accomplishments of each one of them and look forward to seeing all they will accomplish in the future. The Foundation also developed an Alumni Program to be initiated in 2011 and a Leadership Development program with Picerne Military Housing, the company owned and operated by Foundation founder, John Picerne. The 2011 class will be the first of many to represent the great resource this country has in the children of military families.

Each year, the Our Future Scholarship Program offers \$50,000 scholarships to 10 graduating high school seniors who are the children of active-duty Soldiers stationed across the country. The Educational Grant Program offers \$5,000 one-time awards to 20 spouses of active-duty Soldiers. Once a scholar is selected, he or she becomes a part of a network of "family members" who share the experience of being the child or spouse of an active-duty service member and want to further their education in order to give back to the community they love and respect. Foundation staff works closely with students to ensure success in the academic world while facing military-specific challenges like deployments overseas and long separations.

Since 2006, Our Family for Families First Foundation has awarded more than \$3 million in scholarships and grants to the children and spouses of active-duty Service Members. As the Foundation grows and continues to serve more great Americans from the military community, we only hope that our commitment to this mission brings an added appreciation for the sacrifices our military men and women -- and their families -- make every day and the impact that a few people can make through community service.
